DEBRIS CLASSIFICATION

Eligible Debris:

Debris collected within the scope of this plan falls under three possible classifications:

Burnable - includes all biodegradable matter except that included in the following definitions of other categories of debris. It includes but is not limited to damaged and disturbed trees; bushes and shrubs; broken, partially broken and severed tree limbs; untreated structural timber; untreated wood products and brush.
Exception: Some trees or stumps may be better disposed of by using a grinder or chipper for disposal which can be used as mulch.

Non-Burnable - includes, but is not limited to, treated timber; plastic; glass; rubber products; metal products; sheet rock, asphalt; cloth items; non-wood building materials and carpeting. Some non-burnable debris is recyclable. Recyclable debris includes metal products (i.e. mobile trailer parts, household appliances, or uncontaminated soil.

Household/Industrial Hazardous Waste - hazardous waste such as petroleum products, paint products, etc, and known or suspected hazardous materials such as asbestos, lead-based paint, or electrical transformers shall be removed by others qualified and licensed to handle that type of debris.
