# Oklahoma County District 3 Roads and Highways End of Year Update

What a year we've had in 2025. It was one wild and crazy spring and summer with all the rain, fires and other unusual weather. The District 3 Highway Department wears many hats and this year we were everything from Firemen to flood control to storm clearing to road builders. Everything and anything that happens on our rural roads is our business. We appreciate everyone's help and patience as we work on your roads and bridges.



## Coffee Creek- Bryant to Broadway

Currently, one of our big projects is working with Edmond to completely rebuild Coffee Creek between Bryant and Broadway. This project was approved by the Edmond City Council on October 13<sup>th</sup>, and we began work on November 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Currently the project is on schedule even with some minor weather delays. We are planning to stabilize the roadway base the week of December 8<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> with cement slurry. Paving will begin as soon as possible after the slurry has cured.

Asphalts plants close for maintenance between December 22<sup>nd</sup> and the first week in January, so we are pushing hard to have at least a base surface before year end. The road will be closed except for local traffic for the duration of this project.

This will facilitate our ability to complete the project in a shorter time frame.

# Oklahoma County District 3 Roads and Highways End of Year Update - Cont.



## **County Line Intersection at Covell**

As many of you know, the culverts under County Line at Covell are being replaced with a concrete box capable of handling twice the volume of water. Construction is complete on the concrete box and paving is scheduled for the week of December 15<sup>th</sup>. This intersection is being paved with a Kevlar like aramid fiber as a test to see the longevity of high strength materials.

## **County Line 178<sup>th</sup> to 192<sup>nd</sup>**

We are also moving forward with a total rebuilding of County Line between 178<sup>th</sup> and 192<sup>nd</sup>. Our crew is starting to work on the drainage ditches and brush along that stretch of road. We won't be closing that section of County Line until the intersection of Covell and County Line is completed.

## **Sorghum Mill Hiawassee to Henny**

This stretch of road has been in poor condition for quite a while. We had planned to rebuild the western half of this mile last summer, but it was delayed due to the flooding in April and May. Along with rebuilding the western ½ mile, we are going to go ahead and overlay the entire mile to provide a superior driving surface for the entire mile. This is one of our efforts to work on the eastern side of Oklahoma County and bring it up to our high standards.

## **Westminster -Bridge south of Waterloo**

This section of Westminster Road remains closed. We were working with ODOT and the Federal Highway Commission to get funding for this bridge repair. After much discussion, it would be 2-4 years to receive funding from those sources.

Therefore, Commissioner Davidson and I have decided to spend our own money to repair this section of highway. We have 3 bridge designs we are evaluating, and we must choose a contractor. Bridge construction for a prefab bridge takes 4-8 weeks so we hope to have a replacement installed by late spring 2026.

## Future Projects and Information

We are also planning to move ahead with some work on Waterloo between Westminster and Anderson. We are not sure which section we will tackle first at this time but all of them need some work. This has also been delayed waiting on ODOT funding, but we were recently informed that funding may take as long as 2031 so we are going to move ahead. We are also working on a plan for County Line from Danforth to Covell with Piedmont. This is the last section of County Line that needs attention, so we are anxious to find funding as soon as possible. As I mentioned in our last newsletter, we have located various cameras around critical areas of the county to monitor intersections, bridges, flood prone areas and construction projects.
