

UPDATE FROM THE COMMISSIONER

Community Funding and Project Overview: Key Grants, Loans, and Allocated Resources

Several funding sources have been secured for vital infrastructure and environmental projects in the community. These grants and loans have been crucial in supporting local improvements, addressing flooding issues and acquiring necessary equipment. Below is a detailed breakdown of each funding source, the projects they support, and their current status.



1. DEQ On Road 2 Program (VW Settlement Funds)
 - Amount: \$515,338.42 (total), \$154,482.92 received
 - Use: Purchasing water, bucket, and hook trucks for infrastructure maintenance.
 - Status: Partial funding received, remaining balance to be allocated.
2. Federal Emergency Relief Projects
 - Indian Meridian Flooding & Repair: \$20,464.73 (fully awarded)
 - Westminster Flooding & Repair: \$77,050.22 (fully awarded)
 - Covell Flooding & Repair: \$79,412.39 (fully awarded)
 - Use: Flood damage repairs in each area.
3. DEQ Equipment Grant
 - Amount: \$50,000.00 (fully awarded)
 - Use: Purchase of a mulch head for land clearing and vegetation management.
4. OCCEDB/ETR Loans
 - County Line Flooding & Repair: \$500,000.00 (fully received)
 - Westminster Flooding & Repair: \$314,000.00 (fully received)
 - Use: Flood repairs in County Line and Westminster areas.

The community is making significant strides in addressing pressing issues such as flooding, infrastructure upgrades, and equipment needs. The funding received through various grants and loans plays a critical role in these efforts, and local residents can look forward to improved facilities, enhanced emergency response capacity, and a more resilient infrastructure overall.

Community members are encouraged to stay informed and engaged as these projects continue to develop.
